Who we are - What we offer - Our location

Located in Lewiston, Maine, Bates is internationally recognized as a leading liberal arts college of 1800 undergraduate students. CAPS offers graduate training in clinical service provision to advanced Post-Doc, Doctoral, or Masters students in clinical psychology, social work, and clinical counseling/mental health. We provide counseling in an outpatient college setting and offer individual, group, and same-day services in a short-term model of care. We have previously had trainees from:

Details on Training at CAPS

- Two to four days of clinical internship (dependent on program requirements).
- Supervision provided includes one hour of 1:1 supervision weekly and one hour of group supervision weekly.
- Offer initial assessments, consultation, individual and group counseling, same day appointments, outreach and psychoeducational programming. Attend weekly multidisciplinary clinical consultation meetings and present cases in rotation with staff.
- Professional development opportunities to attend training/webinars as related to internship duties.
- Graduate interns are guided by state, federal, and professional affiliation regarding mental health laws and ethical practices.
- ♦ All clinical services are documented in confidential notes in Titanium, the CAPS EMR (electronic medical record) and co-signed by their supervisor.
- CAPS provides a nominal stipend based on the number of days a graduate intern works at CAPS to
 offset travel costs.
