This document has all of the specifics you need for housing selection!

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What is Housing Selection?

Spring Housing Selection is the process for current students to select housing for the upcoming academic year in the [HouseCat Portal](#). Students must submit an application and agree to the Residence Hall and Dining Service Regulations to be eligible for Selection. Housing Selection is binding meaning that once you have confirmed your selection on the HouseCat portal, you will not be able to change your housing. If you do not select housing during housing selection, you will participate in [Summer Placement](#).

In addition to the information in this document, our [Housing Selection website](#) has additional resources and information including building availability and features, floor plans, current room availability, planning documents and historical data, frequently asked questions (FAQs) and much more. The website is one of your primary resources for selection.

Residency Requirement

All students are required to live in on-campus housing during their time at Bates unless they have received approval to live off-campus from Residence Life. Those wishing to apply as commuter students or rising seniors participating in the Off-Campus housing lottery must receive approval from Residence Life to live off-campus. Selection Eligibility

Students must submit an application and agree to the [Residence Hall and Dining Service Regulations](#) to participate in Selection. To be eligible for Selection, you must be enrolled as an active student for the Fall 2025 semester. Your class year and enrollment eligibility will be confirmed on the day your class year's applications are due. You are eligible for specific class year selections based on your class year from the registrar. You may view your status and your class year on Garnet Gateway. If you have any questions about your status or your class year, please contact the Registrar at 207-755-5949 or registrar@bates.edu.

You are NOT eligible for Selection if:

- You were approved to live off campus next year via the off-campus lottery or commuter application.
- Your Fall semester status indicates you are studying abroad, on leave, etc.
- You are currently on a leave that requires you to participate in the re-enrollment process.

If your status changes prior to all selection rounds ending, you may enter the selection process round that is going on at that time. However, if your status changes after the Housing Selection process is complete, you will participate in [Summer Placement](#).

What is new this year?

The whole thing! Which is why we recommend reading this guide and looking through the resources on the Housing Selection website. However, a few highlights of the changes are here:

- **All group sizes will go at the same time:** Unlike the past few years where selection nights were separated by group size, all group sizes will participate in selection in the same round of selection.
- **Selection Nights will be separated by class year:** All students in a class year will select in the same selection round. Mixed class year groups will go at the beginning of the round of the *lowest class year* in the group. More about that can be found in the [Mixed Class Year Groups](#) section below.
- **Selection Rounds will be longer:** Instead of one night, selection rounds will last through the next day. This is to give students more time to rearrange their groups, coordinate with other students, and talk to housing about options and with questions.
- **Students will be able to make changes to groups during selection:** New this year, you will be able to make changes to your group during selection. For example, if an hour into the senior selection round, all of the suites of 6 in Hopkins and Rzasas have been selected, your group of 6 can break up into 3 double groups to try to select into another building together, like Smith. In another example, if 30 minutes into the sophomore selection round there are no longer any singles to select, two people can create a new group so that they can select as a double.
- **Availability Website:** New this year is the [Selection Availability website](#) that will show each room, some of the room and building features, and whether it has been selected or not. This website will update every 10 minutes during selection while timeslots are opening (the first few hours of the selection round) and will update daily outside of that.
- **No groups of 8:** as previously announced, there are no longer blocks of 8 in housing selection. All of Smith will be selected as doubles. More information about building room type breakdowns can be found under [Housing Options](#) below and on the [Housing Selection website](#).

What do these changes mean for you? Our goal is to give students more information about their housing options and provide more autonomy in the process. With these changes, students should all be prepared to be in the HouseCat portal on selection nights in case you need to create a group or your group changes. Also, students should be prepared with their top choices as well as some backup options should their top choices be unavailable at their selection time.

Glossary of Terms

Roommate Group: A roommate group is a group of students that are selecting together. The number of people in the group must match the number of beds in the room or suite you are selecting. For example, a roommate group of 2 will only be able to see double rooms and would not be able to select into a suite of 4. Additionally, a group of 6 would only see suites of 6 as an option. This year in selection, students will be able to edit their roommate groups during selection in order to select a space that works for them given rooms that are available when they are selecting.

Seniors, Juniors, and Sophomores: We use these terms to refer to the class year you will be next academic year. For example, this year, the class of 2026 who are currently juniors are the senior class for next year and would be participating in the Senior round. Any mention of Seniors, Juniors, and Sophomores in selection should be taken to mean Rising Seniors, Rising Juniors, and Rising Sophomores.

Suite: A suite is a group of rooms and a common room behind a door. For more information on room types see [Housing Options](#) below. Also note that just as the room you're selecting is binding once confirmed, bed assignments are also binding. Please make sure that during selection, you are assigning beds correctly as it relates to shared spaces. For example, if you select a 4-person suite made of two double rooms, you are assigning roommates to each double when assigning beds. At move-in, each student will only be able to pick-up the key to the space assigned to them during housing selection.

Timeslot: A timeslot is the **start time** for you to enter the Room Selection portion of the [HouseCat](#) housing portal to pick and confirm your room for the upcoming year. Timeslots are randomly assigned to each roommate group or single student for each class year selection. You can take as much time as you want in the portal, but please be advised other groups will continue to enter the portal and select. Once you add a room to your cart, you will have five minutes to confirm beds before your cart resets.

The Selection Process

- 1) **Application:** Every individual must submit an application
 - The application consists of signing the Residence Hall and Dining Services Regulations for the upcoming year, acknowledging you understand a few components of selection like accommodations and community agreements, confirming your personal details, and completing your housing profile.
 - You must have an application by the application due date for your class year to participate in that round of housing selection.
- 2) **Make a Group:** if you intend to select in a group
 - This step is not necessary if you are intending to select a single.
 - Mixed class year groups must coordinate with the Office of Residence Life to be created, [see below for more information](#).
- 3) **Get a Timeslot:**
 - Timeslots are randomly assigned for each round.
 - Everyone in a group gets the same timeslot.
 - An email will be sent to individuals when timeslot information is released.
- 4) **Select Housing:**
 - The group leader will be the person to log into the portal, select a room, and assign beds for the group.
 - If you do not have a roommate group, you will be acting as a single person and will select housing for yourself.

Housing Options

Please note that this list is a general guide of housing options, and specific options may change based on spaces held for First-Year Centers, ResLife student-staff, and other housing needs. Roommate Groups

- You will only be able to see and invite other students to your group if you have the same class year and they have completed an application. If you are intending to be part of a mixed class year group, [see below for more information](#).
- All members of a group must accept the request to be part of the group. Any pending requests will not be eligible for selection.
- Your group will only be able to see rooms or suites where the number of beds exactly match the number of students in the group.
- You will be able to make changes to your group during selection. This ability will end after the application deadline, but will reopen at the start of selection, and is not impacted by your timeslot. When you make a new group, each individual's timeslot does not change. The timeslot for your new group to get into the selection portion of the portal will, therefore, be based on the new group leader's timeslot.
- If you do not have a roommate group, you will be acting as a single person and will select housing for yourself.
- **Group Leader Info:** The group leader is a vital part of room selection and has many responsibilities in this process including:
 - Selecting the room and assigning beds during the room selection timeslot. Timeslots are randomly assigned to each roommate group or single student for each class year selection. Each member of the group will have the same timeslot and the group leader will be the person to log in and select.
 - Adding members, confirming members, removing members, and deleting the group, if necessary.
 - Passing the Group Leader role to another group member, if necessary.

Mixed Class Year Groups

It is possible to have mixed class year groups in Selection. However, you will be unable to make a mixed class year group on your own in the HouseCat Portal. Instead, you must contact housing@bates.edu so that a group can be manually created for you.

Process

- At least 48 hours prior to the application deadline for the housing selection round you are participating in, email housing@bates.edu and copy each student that wants to be in the group.
- Everyone must reply all to confirm that they want to be in the group.
- Residence Life will then create the group for you.

Other Information

- Mixed class year groups will go at the beginning of the round of the **lowest class year** in the group.
- If Residence Life does not receive email confirmation from everyone in the group prior to the application deadline, the group will not be created for that selection round.
- Any changes to the group prior to the application deadline need to be made in writing (email) and confirmed by all group members (old and new) by the application deadline.
- Breaking up a group during active selection is possible by having the Group Leader contact the Office of Residence Life at either housing@bates.edu or (207) 786-6215. Any student who is in the class year of the current round will have their timeslot randomized and reassigned to be within that same class year round. Any students of the class years above the current round will keep their group's timeslot as they would have been assigned a timeslot at the beginning of selection regardless.
 - For example, if there is a group of 4 with 2 Juniors and 2 Sophomores, the group would get a timeslot of 4:35pm during Sophomore Selection. If they decide to break up the group during active selection, the juniors would keep the 4:35pm time and be able to select housing at that time. The sophomores in the

group would receive randomized timeslots within the other sophomores selecting. One sophomore gets a timeslot at 5:25pm and the other at 6:05pm. They can start selecting housing at those times.

- No mixed year groups can be **newly** created after the Sophomore application deadline.

Roommate Matching

New this year we have a roommate matching event for students looking for roommates! It is March 4th, 2025 from 8:00pm-9:00pm in Memorial Commons. We also highly suggest reaching out to your JA or CA to see if they know of anyone who is looking for a roommate. Additionally, talking to others in your social circles, clubs and orgs, or teams to see if they are looking for roommates or know others who are can be the most helpful. We've also created [this Roommate Matching Guide](#) to assist students seeking roommates in their class year.

Housing Accommodations and Selection

All of the information for [Housing Accommodations can be found on our website](#) including building features and other information regarding which buildings meet certain accommodations, process timelines, frequently asked questions, and much more.

Below is a snippet of information for you most applicable for selection.

Accommodations to a student's housing or a housing process come from one of two campus partner offices. Housing does not decide these accommodations, but implements them once an accommodation has been approved. It is important to note that students are not making a request for a specific housing assignment, but rather a request for an accommodation. Please note that accommodations can be approved for different lengths of time (e.g., a semester, a year, multiple years, etc.), so you will want to ensure that your accommodation is active for the upcoming year prior to housing selection. Details about your accommodation can be found in AIM or by contacting the Office of Accessible Education.

If your accommodation is approved before you have selected housing for the upcoming academic year...

- You will participate in housing selection as any other student would to select a space that fits your accommodation. Residence Life values students selecting their own spaces because it allows them to consider their accommodations and their specific housing preferences to pick a spot that works well for their unique experience at Bates. If you have any questions about what spaces fit your accommodation, please look at the information above or contact housing@bates.edu for more information.
- In some rare circumstances, Residence Life may reach out to students ahead of selection to offer a pre-placement. Pre-placement offers are typically only made to students who are likely unable to meet their accommodations during selection - for example, a rising sophomore with accommodations for a single room and air conditioning. If you are made a pre-placement offer, you would receive that information in February and would be given additional information about your options and next steps.
- If you select housing that does not meet your accommodation, that is okay! Everyone's wants and needs change over time and that decision is entirely up to you. If you later decide that space will not work for you because of your accommodations, you will need to reach out to housing@bates.edu to let Residence Life know. You will likely need to wait until [Summer Placement](#) or until a suitable location opens during the year. Please note that availability for certain types of accommodations may be limited at later points in the year or during a semester.

If your accommodation is approved after you have selected housing for the upcoming academic year...

- If the space you chose during housing selection meets your accommodation, that is great and you would stay in that location!
- If the space you chose during housing selection does not meet your new accommodation and you would like to move, please email housing@bates.edu to talk about moving during [Summer Placement](#).

Housing Changes After Selection

Housing selection is binding meaning that once you have confirmed your selection on the HouseCat portal, you will not be able to change your housing.

We understand that some students may be disappointed with the rooms they select through this process or have hesitations later. Participation in the [Summer Placement process](#) is limited to students who were not able to choose a room during the spring room selection process, or whose roommates have cancelled their housing assignment and vacated a space in their rooms. If you are not happy with the room you select in the spring, you will be able to add yourself to the [Room Change Process](#) once the fall semester begins. However, we encourage all students to give their housing assignments a fair chance – many students find that what they assume about a space or living situation is different than what it is truly like!

Housing Selection and Off-Campus Study

Currently studying away: Selection occurs online through the [HouseCat](#) portal and most students will be able to participate while studying away without issue. If you believe that accessing the portal while away will be an issue for you, please reach out to Residence Life at housing@bates.edu.

Studying away for the upcoming Fall semester: For students who are not enrolled at Bates in the upcoming Fall Semester but will be returning to campus for the upcoming Spring semester, you will not participate in Spring Housing Selection. You will participate in [Winter Placement](#) which typically occurs in November and December the Fall prior to your return.

Studying away for the upcoming Winter semester: You may participate in the current Housing Selection process. Once your study abroad program is confirmed and processed by the Registrar, you will be removed from housing for the winter semester. You will then move out of housing at the end of the fall semester. The [Residential Calendar](#) has those dates!

Dining Rules and Regulations

When living in Bates College Housing, you must agree to and abide by the [Residence Hall and Dining Services Regulations](#). Please note, from the regulations, the Office of Residence Life reserves the right to reassign students for any reason, including the relocation of students without roommates or the placement of additional students in rooms that are not full. Please also refer to the [Residential Calendar](#) which has dates for move ins, move outs, etc. for the upcoming academic year. More information about housing, break housing, and more can be found on [our website](#).

The Office of Residence Life maintains the ability to change, modify, or add to these procedures as necessary.
